

## Bosa Debuts Downtown Exhibit and Lecture Series

Condominium developer Bosa Development plans a Sept. 26 debut for a new community exhibit and lecture series, examining urban planning and other issues impacting downtown San Diego.

A company statement said an exhibition called Rethink Downtown: Behind San Diego's Skyline, will open for a limited run, with no admission charge, at 700 First Ave. It will be open daily from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., with more information at [RethinkDowntown.com](http://RethinkDowntown.com).

Officials said Bosa enlisted an international creative team to curate exhibits in San Diego, London, Los Angeles, New York City and

Vancouver, B.C. Rethink Downtown is curated by Trevor Boddy, a Canadian critic, design consultant and historian of architecture and urbanism.

The exhibition will feature photos and videos, scale models, engaging displays and a lecture series geared to discussions of downtown's past and future, including its emerging innovation hub.

"By presenting the Rethink Downtown exhibition, we hope to get the public locally, regionally, nationally and internationally engaged," said company President Nat Bosa.

Vancouver-based Bosa Development has completed several residential condo towers in downtown San Diego and other West Coast cities. Its current local projects include Pacific Gate, a 41-story luxury condo tower underway near the intersection of Broadway and Pacific Highway, with plans in the works for a similar-sized tower at a nearby site.
